CALL FOR ERASMUS+ STUDY MOBILITY APPLICATIONS

The purpose of this call is to receive applications and to carry out the selection process for students wishing to benefit from Erasmus+ Study Mobility in the Fall or Spring Semester of the 2025-2026 Academic Year within the scope of the 2024 Contract Period Higher Education Mobility Activity Project (2024-1-TR01-KA131-HED-000226733).

The application timetable, procedural details and the applicable terms and conditions are explained in this announcement. In order for your application to be processed appropriately, please read the announcement carefully and complete your application accordingly.

ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME & STUDY MOBILITY

Erasmus+ (2021–2027) is the European Union's funding programme for education, youth, and sports. It supports learning opportunities abroad, including studies, traineeships, professional development, non-formal youth activities, and cooperation between organisations.

Under Key Action 1: Mobility of Individuals, Erasmus+ offers higher education students the opportunity to study, train, and gain professional experience in Europe. The programme is managed by the European Commission and implemented in Turkey by the Turkish National Agency.

Erasmus+ Study Mobility enables full-time undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral students enrolled at a higher education institution in Turkey holding the European Charter for Higher Education (ECHE) to study at an ECHE-accredited institution abroad for a period of 2 to 12 months. This activity involves students completing part of their studies at a partner higher education institution abroad through a bilateral agreement.

Students participating in this activity must be enrolled in a degree programme at their home institution. They are expected to complete a programme abroad equivalent to 30 ECTS credits for one academic term as part of their degree requirements. Full academic recognition is granted for credits successfully completed during the programme. Any failed credits must be retaken at the host institution.

For further information about the Erasmus+ Programme, students are encouraged to visit our website.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Applicants must have completed **at least one semester** in their current degree programme at the time of application.
- 2. Students enrolled in Joint Programmes must be in their **second year** at the time of application.
- 3. A minimum cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of **2.50** for undergraduate and **2.75** for postgraduate programs is required.
- 4. Applicants must take the ELS Erasmus+ English Proficiency Exam or hold a valid TOEFL iBT, IELTS Academic, PTE Academic, or Cambridge English Assessment certificate.
- 5. Applicants must not be in their **final year of study**, as applications are accepted for the following academic year and final-year students are ineligible to apply.





Useful Notes

- Students intending to apply for Study Mobility must consult their <u>Erasmus+ Departmental</u> <u>Coordinators</u> to confirm the suitability of their selected host universities. This includes verifying that the courses offered by the host university align with their current program requirements.
- Students enrolled in double major programs may only apply for mobility within **one major** during the same application period.
- A student may participate in Erasmus+ mobility for a maximum of 12 months within the same
 academic level (undergraduate, postgraduate, or doctoral), regardless of whether the mobility
 is funded or unfunded. For students who have previously participated in the programme and are
 applying again within the same academic level, their total prior mobility duration will be
 subtracted from the 12-month limit.

Eligibility Requirements for Erasmus+ Study Mobility

- Maintain a full-time study load equivalent to 30 ECTS credits at TED University while participating in the study mobility.
- Undertake a course load of at least **30 ECTS credits** at the host university. In exceptional circumstances, a **minimum of 25 ECTS credits** may be permissible, subject to prior approval.
- Prioritize host universities that offer courses compatible with your TED University semester curriculum. Consult your Erasmus+ Departmental Coordinator for advice.

Special Conditions for First-Year Students

Based on the decision taken at the Internationalization Committee Meeting held on June 10, 2020, considering the limited places, it was decided that the following application principles would be taken into account for Erasmus+ Student and Traineeship Mobility starting from the 2020-2021 Academic Year:

- First-year students can be selected for Erasmus+ mobility, but their number must not exceed 50% of the total allocated places for their department.
- If there are insufficient applications from upper-year students (sophomores and juniors), the remaining places will be allocated to first-year students.
- For departments with only one available spot, priority will be given to the highest-ranking upperyear student, even if a first-year student has a higher total score.

Based on the decision taken at the Internationalization Committee Meeting held on April 7, 2022:

- Students enrolled in Joint Degree Programs must complete their department selections before applying for Erasmus+ study mobility.
- Due to the mobility rules and the existing bilateral agreements, Erasmus+ study mobility for firstyear students in Joint Degree Programs cannot be processed before they finalize their department selections.
- Therefore, students enrolled in Joint Degree Programs can only apply for Erasmus+ study mobility from their second year onwards.

IMPORTANT: CONSULT YOUR COORDINATOR BEFORE APPLYING

Before applying, students must contact their <u>Erasmus+ Departmental Coordinator</u> to discuss their university preferences and confirm their eligibility. When selecting universities, it is crucial to verify **course compatibility, language requirements, and ECTS credit alignment** with your Erasmus+ Departmental Coordinator to determine the option that best supports your academic progress.





Preferences submitted without prior consultation with your coordinator may result in the cancellation of your mobility period due to course incompatibilities or unmet ECTS requirements.

Students who do not select their universities under the guidance of their coordinator and, despite being selected, are unable to undertake their mobility period due to course mismatches, may only change their host institution if all other selected candidates have confirmed their placements and if sufficient places remain at the desired new institution. Otherwise, the mobility period will be **cancelled**.

PARTNER UNIVERSITIES & BILATERAL AGREEMENTS

Erasmus+ study mobility is facilitated through bilateral agreements between departments at TED University and universities in Programme (European) countries. Students are strongly advised to choose their preferred universities in consultation with their departmental coordinators.

A comprehensive list of Erasmus+ Bilateral Agreements is available on the <u>TEDU Partner Universities</u> <u>webpage</u>. This list allows students to review universities that have partnerships with their respective departments, along with details regarding the **terms of agreement, language proficiency requirements, and contact information.**

Please note that the host institution reserves the right to modify the terms of the agreement during the nomination process. TED University **cannot** be held accountable for any such changes.

FUNDED PLACES & MOBILITY DURATION

Under the 2024 Contract Period Higher Education Mobility Activity Project (2024-1-TR01-KA131-HED-000226733), the number of participants has been determined in accordance with the agreement signed between the Turkish National Agency and our University, based on the **allocated estimated budget**.

The total number of participants who can be funded is **24**, and the allocation of places has been announced on our <u>website</u>. In order to enable more students to benefit from mobility activities within the current budget, the study mobility period will be funded for **one semester only**.

The provision of additional places is dependent on the allocation of extra funding to our University by the National Agency during the interim report phase of the project.

APPLICATION PROCESS & REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

All applications must be submitted through <u>TURNAPortal</u>, accessible via e-Devlet. Applicants must log in to TURNAPortal using their e-Devlet credentials, access the TED University application page, and

complete their application by the deadline stated in this announcement, no later than 18:00. Applications will be considered incomplete unless the 'Submit Application' button is clicked.

Applicants are strongly advised to carefully review the <u>Application Guide</u> to ensure the proper and complete submission of their applications.

The following information and documents are required during the application process:

1. Language Proficiency Certificate

The following language exams and certificates are accepted for TED University Erasmus+ Programme applications:

- ELS Erasmus+ English Proficiency Exam administered by the TED University English Language School
- TOEFL iBT, IELTS Academic, PTE Academic, Cambridge English Assessment

Applicants must upload their official score reports for the above-mentioned exams in PDF format to TURNAPortal. The accuracy of uploaded documents is the sole responsibility of the applicant.

Important Note: ELS Erasmus+ English Proficiency Exam results will be directly imported into the application system. Therefore, students do not need to upload these results separately. Applicants who believe there is an error in their displayed exam score, or those who wish to use a different valid exam score, must contact our office.

The following language exams and certificates are acceptable for this application call:

- February 24, 2024 ELS Erasmus+ English Proficiency Exam
- December 19, 2024 ELS Erasmus+ English Proficiency Exam
- TOEFL iBT, IELTS Academic, PTE Academic, Cambridge English Assessment

2. Academic Records

Applicants must verify their current cumulative GPA through the e-Devlet system. The accuracy and up-to-dateness of this information is the sole responsibility of the applicant. Applicants who identify any discrepancies in their records must contact the Registrar's Office.

3. Supplementary Documents

Any documents that may influence the weighted score considered in the application evaluation and/or documents supporting requests for additional grant support must be uploaded to TURNAPortal.

EVALUATION CRITERIA & SELECTION PROCEDURES

Erasmus+ student selection is carried out from among the applicants who meet the minimum requirements, in accordance with the evaluation criteria and weighted scores established by the Turkish National Agency. Applicants are ranked from highest to lowest based on their scores. Placement is determined by considering preference order, score, and budget criteria.

Students are ranked according to their Erasmus+ weighted score within their **own departments** and are selected as **funded participants** to fill the available funded places within the framework of the





allocated budget. When determining placements, both the students' overall scores and their preferred university choices are taken into account.

Applications are reviewed and finalised by the Internationalisation Committee. The results, including the scores of all eligible applicants in all evaluated areas, will be published on the university's website.

i. Reserve List Candidates:

Students who are not initially allocated a funded place are put on the **reserve list** according to their Erasmus+ weighted score and are assigned to their preferred universities. However, these placements are made only in accordance with the number of students specified in the agreement quotas of the preferred universities. Reserve list candidates may participate in the mobility with zero-grant by submitting a request within the period specified in the announcement.

ii. Unsuccessful Candidates:

Students who cannot be placed at any university, considering the agreement quotas and their weighted score, are listed as unsuccessful.

The evaluation criteria and weighted scores to be used in assessing mobility applications are set out below:

ERASMUS+ GRANTS & TRAVEL SUPPORT

Students will receive a grant to partially cover their living expenses during their mobility period abroad. The grant is intended as a **contribution** and is not meant to cover all expenses associated with the mobility.

This grant support is provided for **one semester**, or the activity can be undertaken with zero grant funding. Whether a selected student can be supported with a grant for the entirety of the planned study period depends on sufficient funding being available.

Participating countries are divided into three groups based on their cost of living, and monthly grant amounts for study mobility have been established for each group:

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⁶ In addition to the average of academic achievement and language scores, 10 points are deducted from the selection scores of students who have previously benefited from the Erasmus+ Programme within the same study cycle, for each activity (regardless of whether it is for study or traineeship).

⁷ If a student applies for both study and traineeship mobility at the same time, the student will be given the choice of which activity the "-10 point" deduction will be applied to. In this case, the student must submit a petition indicating their preference via email during the application process. If no petition is submitted, the deduction will be applied to the last completed application in the system.





i. Travel Support and Green Travel

To contribute towards students' travel costs, a travel grant is calculated using the <u>Distance Calculator</u> provided by the European Commission. The distance between the starting point of the mobility and the location of the activity is determined in km, and the corresponding travel grant is calculated based on the table below. The grant amount shown in the table for each distance band is for a round trip; it is not doubled. Travel support is a **one-time** payment.

As a general rule, for distances under 500km, participants are expected to travel by means of low-emission transport.

Green travel is defined as travel that uses low-carbon emission means of transport for the most of the journey, such as bus, train, or car-pooling (with at least two people). To be eligible for green travel support, both the outbound and return journeys must use green travel options, and these options must account for over half of the total travel distance.

If necessary, individual support grants may be provided for up to two days for travel immediately before and after the activity, and for up to six days in the case of green travel.

i. Additional Grant Support

The Erasmus+ Programme promotes inclusion and encourages the participation of individuals with fewer opportunities under the Inclusion & Diversity Strategy. An individual with fewer opportunities is a potential participant whose personal physical condition, mental state, or health condition is such that their participation in the project or mobility activity would not be possible without extra financial support.

TED University is committed to ensuring that the principles of equality and inclusion are observed, implemented, and maintained in all Erasmus+ Programme areas, in line with the commitments made under the 2021-2027 Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE).

Participants with fewer opportunities may receive additional grant support in addition to the standard grant they are entitled to. For the purposes of this grant, a participant with fewer opportunities is defined as an individual with limited economic and social opportunities who falls into one of the following subcategories:

- 1. Those subject to Law No. 2828 (those under protection, care, or shelter in accordance with Law No. 2828 of the Ministry of Family and Social Services).
- 2. Students for whom protection, care, or shelter has been ordered under the Child Protection Law No. 5395.
- 3. Those receiving an orphan/death allowance.





- 4. Martyrs'/veterans' spouses and children, and veterans themselves8
- 5. Those receiving a need-based allowance for themselves or their families (a document proving that the student, their parents, or their guardian is receiving financial support from municipalities, public institutions, and organizations such as Ministries, Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundations,1 Foundations General Directorate, the Red Cross, or AFAD at the time of Erasmus+ application is sufficient).
- 6. Individuals with fewer opportunities⁹
- 7. Those who are receiving a need-based or disability allowance for themselves, a parent, or a guardian, in accordance with Law No. 2022 dated 01.07.1976 on Need-Based, Powerless, and Unattended to Turkish Citizens Over 65 and Disabled and Indigent Turkish Citizens. 10
- 8. Students or their first-degree relatives receiving disaster victim assistance from AFAD.¹¹

Student loans from the Credit and Dormitories Institution, similar loans, other grants classified as meritbased, and one-time financial aids are not considered financial assistance within this scope.

Students who fall under the above categories may be provided with Additional Grant Support upon request and on the condition that they provide documentation of their status:

IMPORTANT MATTERS

- Successful applicants to this call are expected to undertake their mobility period for one semester during the Fall or Spring Semester of the 2025-2026 Academic Year. All mobility activities, regardless of funding status (funded or zero-grant), must be completed by the project end date of July 31, 2026.
- When selecting preferred universities, students are advised to choose the maximum number of institutions allowed, keeping in mind the number of partner universities with which their departments hold bilateral agreements. Students should prioritize universities that best align with their academic objectives when ranking their preferences. Changes to these preferences will not be permitted unless there is a compelling reason to do so.
- The funded activity period cannot, under any circumstances, extend beyond July 31, 2026. Students considering applying for mobility during the Spring semester are strongly urged to thoroughly review the academic calendars of their preferred universities and select a suitable period accordingly. Students placed at universities with a Spring semester academic calendar that ends after July must complete their mobility activities no later than July 31, 2026. Students planning to study in countries such as Germany, where academic semesters typically start and end later than in other countries, should be particularly mindful of this when applying.

- For study mobility, the minimum activity period is two full months, and the maximum is 12 full months. If, in the absence of a force majeure 12 situation, the mobility period is shorter than the minimum duration, the mobility will be considered invalid, and no grant payment will be issued. TED University may, under certain circumstances (including but not limited to academic failure, unexcused absences, failure to complete the participant survey, or failure to submit required documentation of participation), reduce grant amounts or demand a full refund of the grant disbursed, provided that the details are stipulated in the agreement to be signed with the participant.
- Students may waive their right to the grant or participate in the programme without grant funding.
 Zero-grant students are subject to the same evaluation criteria and processes as other applicants. Their status as non-funded participants does not affect their eligibility for selection.
- The International Programs Office will offer support throughout the process, and some required documents will be provided by our office. However, students are responsible for securing and funding their own passports, visas, insurance, and travel arrangements.
- Selected students should be aware that they are initially considered provisional candidates.
 To participate in the mobility, candidates are responsible for applying to the host university after nomination by TED University and obtaining formal acceptance. They are further responsible for completing all required official procedures and documentation, preparing their Learning Agreements without course conflicts, and, importantly, applying for their visas in a timely manner.
- In cases not covered in this announcement, the guidelines set forth by the Turkish National Agency in the 'Erasmus+ Programme Handbook for Higher Education Institutions for the 2024 Contract Period' shall apply.
- The Internationalization Committee reserves the right to make changes to the exams, application process, and evaluations as deemed necessary.

¹² "Force majeure" refers to any unforeseeable, exceptional situation or event beyond the parties' control that prevents either of them from fulfilling any of their obligations. This cannot be attributed to error or negligence on their part or on the part of their subcontractors, affiliated entities, or third parties involved in the implementation, and proves unavoidable despite exercising due diligence. Labor disputes, strikes, or financial difficulties cannot be invoked as force majeure, nor can any default of a service, defects in equipment or material, or delays in making them available, unless they directly result from a relevant case of force majeure.
